



As of January 15, 2020, digital routes and waypoints will be available at routeinfo.no from Haugesund to Stad in Western Norway – for ships arriving and departing Norwegian ports

More efficient route planning

The route service provides a complementary route reference to be used as a basis for voyage planning. The routes must be adapted to suit individual vessels and sailing conditions.

Quality-assured routes

Reference routes are quality-assured by nautical experts in the NCA Pilot Service, Aids to Navigation Service and Vessel Traffic Service. The routes are quality-assured for vessels up to 150 metres in length and 9 meters in draught.

Route-related information

Important route-related information is included – such as local regulations for the voyage, available ports and quays, and sailing distances.

Turn radius standard

A turn radius of 0,3 nautical miles is the set standard for waypoints. Waypoints and turn radius must be adapted to vessel and situation as part of the route planning.

Smart navigation

The digital route service provides automatic and seamless information, thereby facilitating smart navigation on the Norwegian coast.

A wide route selection

As of mid-January 2020, a total of 266 digital routes will be available at routeinfo.no.
